About us

We understand that life as a carer can be challenging. Getting the support and help you need shouldn't be.

Any of our lives could be turned upside down due to the ill-health, frailty or disability of a family member or friend. In fact, two in three of us can expect to become a carer in our lifetime.

There are currently 5.7 million unpaid carers in the UK, however carer charities estimate that number could be as high as 10.6 million. Their huge contribution saves our economy £184 billion each year - the cost of a second NHS. Each carer's needs and situation are unique, but many face similar challenges. They can struggle to balance employment, finances, or their own wellbeing and time for themselves with their caring role. They may not be aware of the help and support available to them - and that is why we are here.

Carers First works directly with, and for carers, providing personalised information and tailored support in the way that suits them: online, on the phone, or face to face in their local community. With the help of our supporters and volunteers, we can continue to be there for carers, helping them find balance, and to live their lives to the fullest - today, and for years to come.

Our support and services are designed with carers, ensuring the support we offer is inclusive and accessible to all carers in different communities.

How we work

We support young carers, young adult carers and adult carers throughout England with our comprehensive online offer including information, advice and guidance, tools, resources and training, as well as through our vibrant online peer support communities.

We also deliver locally commissioned services in Lincolnshire, Essex, Medway, Southend and in four London Boroughs.

We offer a range of support options for carers to access in ways that work best for them:

- **Face-to-Face Support:** Available both one-to-one and in group settings, providing personalised and community-based assistance.
- **Online Support:** Accessible resources and virtual sessions to ensure carers can connect with us anytime, anywhere.
- **Dedicated Helpline:** A trusted source of advice, guidance, and a listening ear for carers navigating their journey.
- **Extensive Online Resources:** Comprehensive and easy-to-use tools, guides, and information to empower carers with knowledge and confidence.
- **Collaborative Partnerships:** Working with organisations and communities to provide a seamless network of support tailored to carers' needs.

Our impact and reach

Carers First Impact Framework sets out our Theory of Change and the measures and tools we use to understand the outputs, outcomes and impact of the support we provide.

Last year, we reached over 330,000 people to provide information about caring and 51,000 carers are registered with us to receive information and support.

In numbers

- 96% of carers felt more resilient in their caring role after our support.
- 95% of carers felt listened to and that their own needs were taken into account through our interventions.
- 93% of carers felt more confident and informed in their caring role after our support.

Job Description

Purpose of the role:	To deliver targeted support to Young Adult Carers aged 16–25, improving resilience, wellbeing, and access to education, employment, and training opportunities. The postholder will provide one-to-one and group-based support, facilitate peer networks, and build partnerships with local organisations to ensure Young Adult Carers can achieve their potential while managing caring responsibilities

Job Overview

The Young Adult Carer Support Worker will

1. Deliver person-centered, strengths-based support to Young Adult Carers, providing tailored information, advice, guidance, and support planning that helps them achieve their goals, build resilience, and access the right opportunities and services at the right time.
2. Support Young Adult Carers through key life transitions, working alongside education providers, community services, and other partners to help them navigate education, training, employment, and adulthood. Deliver flexible support through one-to-one sessions, groups, workshops, and community-based activities.
3. Build positive relationships and community connections that help identify and engage Young Adult Carers who may benefit from support. Develop effective partnerships with education providers, community organisations, employers, and Carers First colleagues to increase awareness and improve access to services.
4. Maintain high-quality and accurate records that demonstrate the difference the service makes for Young Adult Carers. Use Carers First systems to record activity, outcomes, and impact, supporting service improvement, accountability, and reporting requirements.

Responsibilities and Duties

1. Person-Centred Practice and Quality Support Delivery

- Provide a holistic, personalised, strengths-based service to young carers, grounded in trust, respect, and dignity.
- Deliver high-quality information, advice, guidance, and emotional and practical support that responds to identified need.
- Work collaboratively with Young Adult Carers to develop personalised support and action plans that build resilience, confidence, and sustainability in the caring role.
- Maintain a strong understanding of support available to young carers and ensure advice and information provided is accurate, relevant, and timely.

2. Engagement, Transitions and Developmental Support

- Work closely with young adult carers through key transitions into adulthood, supporting access to education, training, employment, and appropriate services.
- Coordinate and contribute to targeted workshops and activities that empower Young Adult Carers to make informed choices about their future.
- Deliver support flexibly through a range of methods, including 1:1 support, groups, school-based work, home visits, and virtual engagement.
- Develop this funded project in a meaningful, outcome-driven way that meets the expectations of funders while remaining responsive to Young Adult Carers lived experience.

3. Partnership Working, Safeguarding and Professional Contribution

- Be proactive in identifying Young Adult Carers through partnership working, outreach, and relationship-building with community groups, education providers, and internal teams.
- Work closely with Carers First Operational Teams to assess local need, facilitate referrals, and ensure coordinated support.
- Attend and contribute to safeguarding meetings relating to young adult carers on the caseload and support colleagues where required.
- Contribute to awareness-raising activity, including national events such as Young Carers Action Day, Carers Week, and Carers Rights Day.
- Work flexibly to meet service need, including occasional evenings, school holidays, and activities outside standard working hours.

Carers First is committed to safeguarding children, young people and vulnerable adults from abuse and expects all staff and volunteers to share this commitment.

The postholder will be required to work flexibly in approach, activities, and priorities, adapting to emerging needs of Young Adult Carers, families, and the organisation. This may include undertaking a range of tasks beyond those listed and adjusting delivery methods to ensure services remain responsive and effective.

These are the normal duties that are required for this position. However, it is necessary for all employees to be flexible and they may be required, from time to time, to perform other duties as may be required for the efficient running of the charity. This Job Description is non-contractual, it will be subject to reviews and may change.

The postholder will take responsibility to integrate safeguarding into all aspects of their work, complying with organisational policies and frameworks.

The postholder will be expected to ensure that their work complies with contractual terms and conditions, the charity's policies and procedures and key legislation, including the General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR) and charity law.

- NVQ Level 2 or relevant experience
- Evidence of further relevant training or continuing professional development

Skills and Experience

- At least 1 year experience of working with young people (ideally vulnerable groups or carers)
- Understanding of safeguarding and young adult development
- Ability to deliver both one to one and group interventions
- Strong communication and relationship building skills
- Ability to work collaboratively with partners
- Good organisational, IT, and record-keeping skills
- Understanding of social media platforms
- Understanding and knowledge of the health and social care sector

Desirable

- Knowledge of issues affecting Young Adult Carers
- Experience in employment/education support or youth work
- Experience delivering workshops or training
- Understanding of local services in Medway

Personal Qualities

- Ability to demonstrate understanding of and an **ambitious** commitment to the goals and values of the charity.
- Demonstrate a **positive** level of professional credibility, integrity, and emotional resilience.
- Self-motivated, **collaborative**, and able to work flexibly, whilst maintaining good work/life balance.
